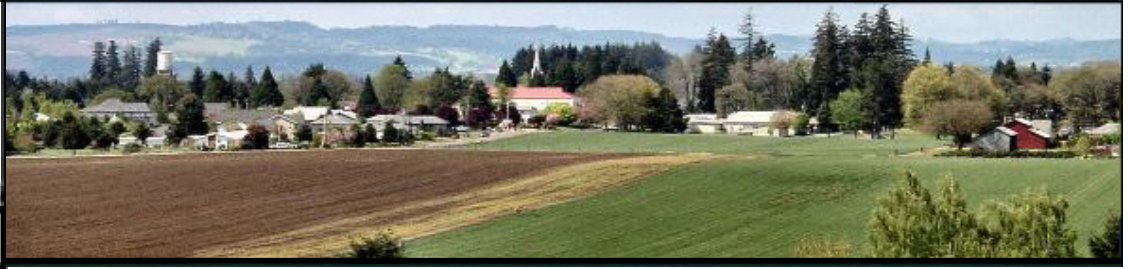

SHERIFF'S CORNER

The Sheriff's Office is honored to have been selected to provide law enforcement services to the City of Sublimity. As with the establishment of any new partnership, we are getting to know one another. First, we wish to share a little about our established core functions and the way we perform our duties. The Sheriff's Office maintains four core functions and they are: 1) To keep our community safe; 2) To work collaboratively with our community and public safety partners; 3) To seek and retain professional and competent staff; and 4) To be fiscally responsible. These core functions are described more in depth on our website, along with more of our Office foundation, which you can find linked to your City site. We encourage you to read more about this and would be enjoy the opportunity to answer any questions.

Since the City Council's decision to contract with our Office, we have been working closely with city officials to formalize that contract, but we have also been analyzing our Office structure to ensure we are ready to meet your city's expectations and the residents' needs. One way that we felt we could better serve you as well as our other contract partners is with a supervisor specifically assigned to oversee all contracts – Sublimity, Jefferson, Chemawa Indian School and the Salem/Keizer School District – totaling seven deputies. An interview panel, including Sublimity and Jefferson representatives, selected Sergeant Dave Cornforth to fill the role. This position was a reallocation of an existing Sergeant position, previously assigned to the Community Relations Unit. We hope residents feel the added value of having a Sergeant in this role.

We are currently in the interview phase and will be introducing the Sublimity Deputy in the next couple of weeks. As we move toward July 1st, we want to express our gratitude to the Sublimity Mayor and City Council for the opportunity to provide public safety services to the Sublimity community. We are working collaboratively with the Stayton Police Department to ensure the residents experience a seamless transition. We are excited about becoming part of your community. We'll see you soon.
