Registration forms can be printed from the City's website

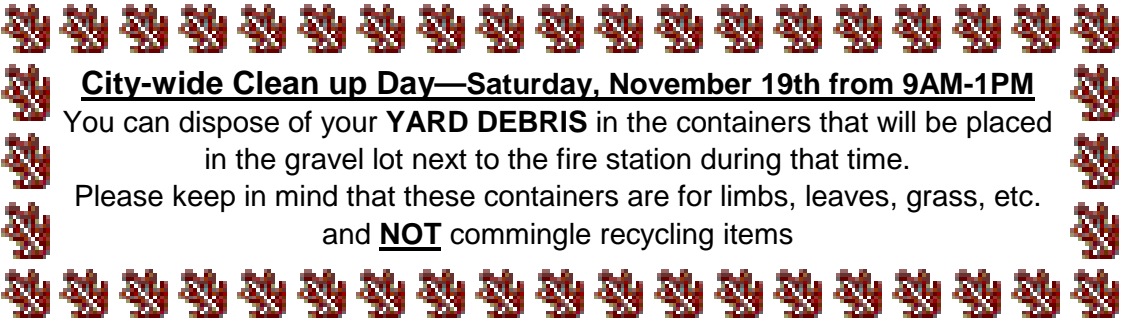

## DEPUTY'S CORNER

Some tips on how to minimize your risk against Identity Theft. First, protect your Social Security Number. There really is absolutely no reason to carry your Social Security Card in your wallet anymore, so if you can avoid it, leave it in a safe place, or better yet an actual safe at home. Second, shred everything. Receipts, bills that you have paid, credit applications, insurance forms, old checks, old credit cards, health care receipts, etc. The list truly is endless. Shredders are cheap, even for heavy duty models, plus you can recycle the shredded paper. Third, be careful when using the internet. This seems to go without saying, but invest in some good anti-virus software. Some of them can be expensive, but this is because they work. Fifth, pay with cash if possible when out, or just pay as you go instead of starting a tab. I hate having to pay a machine three dollars to get my money out of the ATM, but it's far more expensive to have your cards and identification taken. Lastly, just be smart about protecting your personal information. Think about this, we will go to extremes to protect our identities, but then wear our lives on the rear windows and bumpers of our rigs. You can tell a lot about a person and family by the bumper stickers and decals with their kids' names and team jersey numbers splashed across the rear of their cars. I too am guilty of this one. So, just be aware of these and several other tips I'm sure you have heard before and report any ID theft immediately. Often criminals will literally begin using a credit, or debit card faster than you can call it in. I'm not saying to be so paranoid that you trust absolutely no one, but a little paranoia is okay. It really is.
