Garage Sale Permit

A reminder that in order to have a garage sale, you must first have a garage sale permit. (2 allowed per year) Permits are available at City Hall during normal business hours for \$3.00.

Reminder

City Ordinance states that no Recreational vehicles can be parked in the driveway or street or more that 72 hours. Please load and unload or vehicles and have them moved as soon as possible to avoid fees.

Park Rentals are now available for the summer months. Visit City Hall for a reservation form and to pay the \$50 fee.

Hi Everyone,

Thank you for all the responses to the fluoride in Sublimity's water, the Council has not taken any action and I appreciate all your responses and please continue to send them to me or to City Hall.

I talked to Deputy Tom Barber and Councilor Greg Atkins about the recent delinquent activities in our town. Greg mentioned on Nextdoor that Sublimity has access to Marion County Sheriff's Deputies 24 hours a day while we are contracting with them for 40hr/week. Tom told me that we have had numerous patrols from non-contracted deputies at times when Tom is not working. Deputy Tom Barber and the entire Marion County Sheriff's office are committed to keeping us safe! Tom told me that some simple things like locking your car and keeping your belongings out of site or out of the car will help prevent crimes of opportunity.

Boy Scouts troop 50 has many boys that are working on their Eagle Scout projects. We have 2 projects in Sublimity. Evan Kingsbury will be installing 2 benches and a water fountain at the dog park in the Hassler Subdivision. Sebastian Baker will be working on the War Memorial in the Church park. I'll keep you posted as to their progress and how the community can be involved.

Frequently asked Questions at City Hall

Along with City Ordinance, you should always check with your CCR's before building accessory structures or parking a recreational vehicle in your driveway. CCR's take precedence over the City Ordinances.

Backflow Devices: Backflow devices must be tested annually. A list of backflow inspectors can be found on the City website or at City Hall.

Building a fence? Please make sure you contact City Hall for a permit. Although there is no fee to build a fence, the city does have codes that need to be followed and they require approval.

Building a storage shed? Sheds under 200sq feet do not require a permit. If you are building anything bigger you must get a structural permit from the city and follow city codes.
