Water Conservation Tips:

- ❑ Check household faucets for leaks. A faucet with even a slow drip takes 10- 25 gallons of water. 15 drips per minute adds up to almost 3 gallons of water wasted per day.
- ❑ Keep showers to 5 minutes or less in length. A five-minute shower takes 10- 25 gallons.
- ❑ Keep a pitcher of water in the refrigerator. You won't have to run tap water to cool it.
- ❑ Use a broom to sweep your driveway, garage, or sidewalk instead of using water.
- ❑ Use a bucket of water to wash your bike or the family car and rinse quickly with a hose.
- ❑ Water your lawn in the evening or in the early morning to avoid evaporation. Be careful to water only the lawn and not the sidewalk or street, and do not over-water.
- ❑ Use water only when you need it. Don't leave water running; be sure to turn it off when you are finished.
- ❑ Condition the soil with mulch or compost before planting grass or flowerbeds so that water will soak in rather than run off.
- ❑ Fertilize lawns at least twice a year for root stimulation, but do not over-fertilize.
- ❑ Use drip irrigation systems for bedded plants, trees, shrubs, or turn soaker hoses upside down so the holes are on the bottom. This will help avoid evaporation.
- ❑ Don't forget to check outdoor faucets, sprinklers and hoses for leaks.

Frequently asked Questions at City Hall

Along with City Ordinance, you should always check with your CCR's before building accessory structures or parking a recreational vehicle in your driveway. CCR's take precedence over the City Ordinances.

Lost and Found: City Hall has a lost and found. If you have lost something in one of the City parks, be sure to check with City Hall to see if it has been turned in. If you find that someone has left a belonging behind, you can turn it in to City Hall.

Backflow Devices: Backflow devices must be tested annually. A list of backflow inspectors can be found on the City website or at City Hall.

Building a fence? Please make sure you contact City Hall for a permit. Although there is no fee to build a fence, the city does have codes that need to be followed and they require approval.

Building a storage shed? Sheds under 200sq feet do not require a permit. If you are building anything bigger you must get a structural permit from the city and follow city codes.

Parking on Street: NO Parking of Cargo Trailers, RVs, Boats or any vehicle of any type is allowed on the street for more than 72 hours.

Garage Sales: You are required to obtain a \$5.00 permit from City Hall before having a garage sale.

Pets: Pets are required to be kept on leash at all times while in city parks. Pet owners are required to clean up after their animals. Mutt Mitts are available in the parks.
