BACKFLOW TESTING REMINDER FOR UNDERGROUND SPRINKLERS

It is required by both State and Local law to have your backflow assembly tested annually.

Now is a good time to start thinking about getting an inspection scheduled for your home. If you have a backflow prevention assembly (lawn sprinkler system) on your property, please do your part to ensure a safe drinking water supply for yourself and everyone in Sublimity.

MILLIMAN NAMED SUBLIMITY JUDGE

NOW SERVES AS JURIST IN SIX CITIES

Retired Brookings City Manager Gary Milliman has been appointed to serve as Sublimity Municipal Court Judge.

The appointment was made by the Sublimity City Council on February 14, 2022.

Milliman currently serves as Municipal Court Judge in the cities of Brookings, Port Orford, Bandon, Powers and Lakeside handling cases including nuisance properties, abandoned vehicles, animal control, traffic and other matters, such as Minors-in-Possession.

When the Brookings City Council voted to add traffic cases to the jurisdiction of the Municipal Court in 2013, then City Manager Milliman organized and implemented the Court expansion. Similarly, he will assist Sublimity in establishing their new Municipal Court, which will focus on municipal code violations.

“I look forward to working with the City Council and staff in Sublimity to initiate this new community service,” Milliman said.

Milliman has completed several courses of study at the National Judicial College (NJC), including the “Special Courts Jurisdiction” program as required by the State of Oregon to serve as a non-attorney Municipal or Justice Court Judge. He has attended conferences conducted by the Oregon Municipal Judges Association (OMJA) to develop his knowledge and skills as a rural magistrate.

He serves on the OMJA Board of Directors, and part of Milliman’s judicial role in the cities he serves is keeping the City leadership updated on changes in State Law and procedures affecting the Municipal Court.

“While I am not an attorney, I have extensive experience in working with the law through my 47-year career as a City Manager and as a legislative analyst/advocate. I have managed code enforcement programs, written legislation, and have interpreted federal/state/local law. I have participated in depositions, served as an “expert witness” in federal court, and assisted prosecutors in a variety of cases,” Milliman said of his experience.

Milliman retired as City Manager in Brookings in 2018 after 11 years and has a continuing non-compensated relationship with the City as City Manager Emeritus. He recently served as City Manager Pro Tem in Ashland.

A Credentialed City Manager with the International City/County Management Association, Milliman served as City Manager in five cities ranging in population from 2,800 to 105,000. He also served as a City Council Member, as Southern California Director for the League of California Cities, as a newspaper editor and as a small business owner.

Milliman holds a Master of Public Administration degree from the University of Southern California and completed the Senior Executives in State and Local Government Program at Harvard University.

Frequently asked Questions at City Hall

Along with City Ordinance, you should always check with your CCR’s before building accessory structures or parking a recreational vehicle in your driveway. CCR’s take precedence over the City Ordinances.

Lost and Found: City Hall has a lost and found. If you have lost something in one of the City parks, be sure to check with City Hall to see if it has been turned in. If you find that someone has left a belonging behind, you can turn it in to City Hall.

Building a fence? Please make sure you contact City Hall for a permit. Although there is no fee to build a fence, the city does have codes that need to be followed and they require approval.

Building a storage shed? Sheds under 200sq feet do not require a permit. If you are building anything bigger you must get a structural permit from the city and follow city codes.

Parking on Street: NO Parking of Cargo Trailers, RVs, Boats or any vehicle of any type is allowed on the street for more than 72 hours.
