City of Sublimity Mayor's Message

The City of Sublimity is doing great; here are some of the items that happened in 2023 and what to expect in 2024:

- We are in the process of building a 750,000-gallon reservoir to replace the 500,000-gallon reservoir at the Boedigheimer site east of town. This project was co funded with a \$1,000,000 grant from Marion County and it will help with increased capacity and pressure. It is on track to be completed by this July.
- We are in the process of renegotiating our wastewater contract with Stayton. As many of you know, our wastewater flows to Stayton's treatment plant. More on that to follow later this spring.
- The city started the process of updating its TSP (Transportation System Plan). This plan will help us identify any shortcomings and plan for our transportation needs.
- At the end of last year two of our senior Planning Commission members (Randy Cranston and Ron Etzel) resigned. I want to Thank Randy and Ron for their many hours of dedication to Sublimity; their hard work and dedication has maintained Sublimity's livability for many years to come. Thank you, Randy and Ron!
- The City is monitoring its water and wastewater infrastructure and coming up with a plan to ensure that we are addressing any potential issues as the system ages.
- We are very proud of our City Staff; they work hard to make sure the city is operating as efficiently as possible!

I look forward to seeing you at the different events this year like National Night Out, POW/MIA event or the Movies in the Park. Feel free to reach out to me or any of the City Councilors (Mike Taylor, Jim Crowther, Brian Schumacher and Tass Morrison) if you have any questions or concerns. We are here to serve you!

Frequently asked Questions at City Hall

Along with City Ordinance, you should always check with your CCR's before building accessory structures or parking a recreational vehicle in your driveway. CCR's take precedence over the City Ordinances.

Lost and Found: City Hall has a lost and found. If you have lost something in one of the City parks, be sure to check with City Hall to see if it has been turned in. If you find that someone has left a belonging behind, you can turn it in to City Hall.

Garage Sales: You are required to obtain a \$5.00 permit from City Hall before having a garage sale.

Pets: Pets are required to be kept on leash at all times while in city parks. Pet owners are required to clean up after their animals. Mutt Mitts are available in the parks.

Building permits: All structural Permits for shops, additions, new homes or ADU's must be submitted at City Hall.
